

We have all been shocked and saddened by the untimely death of Bishop David O'Connell, who departed from us on February 18, 2023. We were even more alarmed when we learned how he

died. How could such a beautiful loving, selfless man of God and prayer die, so violently? I still am having a very difficult time comprehending the "void" that Bishop Dave's death put into my heart.

In the past few weeks there have been images on the news, showing how he was a champion for the poor, the needy, the marginalized. When news of his death became national and global news, prayer services and novenas were started throughout the parishes and churches throughout our country. Then came the statements of condolences and sympathy from President Biden, statements from Pope Francis remembering the bishop for his "profound concern for the poor, immigrants and those in need. Archbishop Gomez's message reiterated Bishop Dave's "compassion to the poor, to the homeless, to the immigrant and to all those living on society's margins." Volunteer of the Gear

At our February Board meeting, Linda was voted to be our Volunteer of the Year, and she will be acknowledged as our recipient at the Downey Coordinating Council Celebration dinner on May 10, 2023 at the Women's Club. The unanimous vote for her recognition is a testament to her service commitment.

Linda still remembers when Jim Dornan recruited her and Pat Wilson to help with computer work at the Living Help Center (LHC), where she and Pat Wilson worked together in the evenings preparing the monthly 'thank you' letters for LHC donors. It was at the LHC where Linda met Lou Ugliano and Terry Lambros, and they invited her to join the Women's Guild. She also met Vicki Carnevale, who always helped her decorate the baby crib for the annual LCH Baby Supply Drive at OLPH held every January. Looking back, Linda happily acknowledges that the Guild has been more than a social outlet for her, it has become her spiritual support, and she feels blessed to work with all Guild members.

The volunteer activity Linda cherishes the most is her work in the Tuna Sandwich Program. One day, she delivered a few cans of tuna to the home of Georgianna Higson, founder of the Sandwich Program. Georgie invited Linda into her home, and during their visit she heard Georgie's deep commitment to serve God's poor. She was still working at the time, but she never forgot the spirituality of Georgie and her mission. Once she retired and with encouragement from Irma Saavedra, Linda and Glenn became involved with the Tuna Sandwich Program. Sally and Bill Johnston along with Jimmy and Diane Andrews made sure all food preparations were ready every Tuesday evening for the sandwich prep team. Linda and Glenn, along with other regular helpers, Miguel Tamayo, Ovidio Diaz, Carlos Zevallos, Ron Meyer, and Mike Cimino to name a few, met in the school kitchen to make sandwiches. Glenn was the official sandwich counter, and he would give everyone a 'shout out' when they reached their goal of 400 sandwiches.

In March 2020, the Tuna Sandwich Program closed due to the Covid pandemic restrictions. While they could no longer make sandwiches for the homeless in downtown Los Angeles, Linda and Glenn made connections with Downey First Christian Church, St. Dominic Savio, St. John of God, St. Hilary and St. Linus to share our bread donations with them. With Fr. Danny's recommendation, they deliver bread and pastries to the Franciscan Sisters who serve the homeless and poor in Boyle Heights.

Because of Linda's reputation as a quiet reliable helper, OLPH and community leaders call her to help those with emergency needs. She might get a call from Irma Saavedra about an OLPH family in need, or most recently from Kimberly Barnette from Los Angeles Homeless Shelter Authority (LAHSA) asking for food and clothing to help those temporarily displaced by the recent rains and flooding. And, when Linda has called her Guild members for help, we have responded. **Continue on page 4**

Embrace Grace

The Religious Education Congress opened fully in-person for the first time in three years. It was on the first weekend of Lent and was marred by the horrific news

of the death of Bishop David O'Connell. "Embrace Grace" was theme chosen for this Congress, and in our pain and sorrow, we were invited to enter deeply into the mystery of God's love for us.

Sacred Space is an area where all are invited to spend time in Eucharistic Adoration and prayer. This year a tribute to Bishop Dave was added and we were invited to leave a message of love and gratitude.

In the main arena, a beautiful multicultural and multilingual prayer service was led by lay ministers and attended by Archbishop Jose Gomez, the Bishops of Los Angeles, many of their fellow bishops and priest, and a full house of the faithful.

This year's keynote speaker was Bishop Joseph A. Espaillat II, an auxiliary bishop of the Archdiocese of New York. He was appointed by Pope Francis in January 2022. Bishop Joe is the youngest Catholic bishop and the first Dominican bishop in the United States. Bishop Espaillat was named in 2015 as pastor of St. Anthony of Padua Catholic Church in The Bronx, New York, a position he still holds. He grew up in Manhattan where he learned to speak three languages: English, Spanish, and Street! He loves ministering the sacraments, celebrating the holy sacrifice of the Mass, hearing confessions, and proclaiming the Word of God.



Bishop Joe spoke about evangelizing to youth and about his hope for a spiritual renewal. He brought a message of hope and the fire of the Holy Spirit. And he left us all on fire!

Every day we had the opportunity to worship together in beautiful liturgies that highlighted just a few of the 40 different languages and cultures in our Archdiocese. Sara Hart, catholic composer, so eloquently expressed how we are one church but so many different expressions. Traveling the United States, she gets to experience a lot of different cultures and sees the universality of the church. She spoke of being culturally and geographically sensitive to how parishes express worship yet at the same time, follow the same rubrics. She spoke about being a product of Appalachia where church music has guitars, and autoharps and mandolins, whereas back East it's choir lofts and organs,

and here is a melting pot of so many different cultures. I loved that we were able to taste some of those different cultural liturgies that make up the Body of Christ, in Los Angeles, the nation and the world.

In all our workshops, we had the opportunity to reflect on the experience of the power of God's grace given to each of us in the Sacrament of the Eucharist. This weekend, I was blessed to have the opportunity to continue deepening God's invitation to "Embrace Grace", and to become the Eucharistic love for my family, church, and community.

"Shepherd for his People." He was truly a "Shepherd for his People." Monsignor Timothy Dyer, pastor of St. Patrick's Church in Los Angeles, remarked how Bishop Dave "was passionate about standing up for immigrants, standing against racism and standing up for the unborn and women." At the funeral Mass at the Cathedral Monsignor Jarleth Cunnane, pastor of St. Cornelius Church in Long Beach, who was Bishop Dave's classmate in the seminary in Dublin and "soul friend" of Bishop Dave for 52 years, delivered the eulogy. He quoted an eloquent poetic phrase from the ancient Greek philosopher Aeschylus, "In our sleep, pain which cannot forget falls drop by drop upon the heart until, in our own despair, against our will, comes wisdom through the awful grace of God." Yes, we are sad, but we have gained wisdom and grace. Grace that Bishop Dave showed us throughout his 45 years serving the Archdiocese of Los Angeles.

Our family had the pleasure of knowing Bishop Dave for 42 years. Our first encounter was as an "engaged" couple being counseled in preparation for the Sacrament of Matrimony at St. Raymond's Church in 1981.

"Shepherd for his People." A few years later Bishop Dave married Alex and I at St. Hilary's Church in Pico Rivera. During our married life, Bishop Dave was always there for all of the major milestones in our lives; First Communion for my daughter, Michelle, later in 2002, officiating at John and Michelle's marriage, baptizing both of my grandchildren,

Annelise and Riley, visiting Alex in the hospital when he suffered a stroke, blessing our new homes, speaking at Alex's retirement dinner celebration, and ultimately presiding over the Christian Burial Mass for my Alex, in August of 2020. Now with the culmination of Bishop Dave's death, the "full circle experience" of Bishop Dave with the Santana Family, has been closed.



Yes, we are all saddened by the death of our dear "soul friend." In Gaelic the phrase soul friend is called the "Anam Cara," which is rooted in the Celtic tradition meaning "a person who acted as a teacher, companion or spiritual guide." Yes, Bishop Dave personified all of these things in our lives.

However, in the depth of our darkness, comes light. We are now filled with the infinite, abundant grace that Bishop Dave has received from God in Heaven. Grace, that is ready to flow upon us all. As Bishop Dave's nephew spoke so poignantly at his Uncle's funeral. "We now have the opportunity to pick up where Bishop Dave left off. We can carry on the example that he set. Help those that need our help. Have patience and give everyone a chance." So let's celebrate and keep the spirit of Bishop Dave forever in all of our hearts. We can now be his hands, his feet, his devotion for others. We can be the "helping hands" for our neighbors. We "can give and not count the cost."

I am enclosing an excerpt from an Irish hymn, The Deer's Cry by Shaun Davey, which was sung at his funeral.

"Christ with me, Christ before me, Christ behind me, Christ in me, Christ beneath me, Christ above me, Christ on my right, Christ on my left, Christ when I day down, Christ when I sit down, Christ when I arrive, Christ to shield me, Christ in the heart of everyone who thinks of me, Christ in the mouth of everyone who speaks of me. I arise today!"

Jesus I Trust in You! This was Bishop Dave's personal motto when he became Bishop. It represents his personal spirituality and theologically based philosophy of life and is grounded in Sacred Scripture.
