In today's digital age, many organizations are choosing to move away from the humble newsletter to online. The Guild board has opted to experiment with a hybrid newsletter with its June/July/August edition. A four-page hard copy version will be printed and mailed to all members and an expanded version will appear on our website at: womensguild.olphdowney.com or you may download the online newsletter on your smartphone, laptop or computer by using the QR code on page 2. Over 60% of our members are email accessible making this trial run possible.

Transitioning a traditional newsletter to an online format may seem daunting, however I would like to explain why we have taken this action.

- 1. *Improved Communications:* An online newsletter is interactive; you can easily click on links to learn more about specific stories, and share the newsletter with others.
- 2. *Increased Environmental Sustainability.* Converting to online can have a positive impact on the environment by reducing the amount of paper waste generated by the Guild.
- 3. *Increased Accessibility:* An online newsletter can be accessed from anywhere with an internet connection. You can read the newsletter on your computer, tablet or smartphone making it easy to stay up-to-date on the latest Guild news and information.
- 4. *Cost Savings:* With an online newsletter, the cost of printing and postage is eliminated which can result in significant savings for the Guild.
- 5. *Faster Delivery:* An online newsletter can be delivered instantly, ensuring our members receive the latest information as soon as it is available.
- 6. **Better Tracking:** It is much easier to track member engagement. This information can be used to better understand what content is resonating with our members and what areas need improvement.

Hi Everyone,

Before we know it, summer will be here! Below I have listed a few tips to stay healthy during the next few summer months:

Health Tips for Summer:

Stay hydrated: Always remember to drink plenty of water throughout the day. Consider adding some cucumber, mint or lemon to your water for added flavor. Try to avoid artificial sweeteners.

Protect your skin: Apply sunscreen with a high SPF and wear protective clothing, such as hats and sunglasses, to prevent sunburn and other skin damage.

Eat light and fresh: Incorporate more fresh fruits and vegetables into your diet to keep your body cool and hydrated (look for what fruits and vegetables are in season!) Avoid heavy, greasy, or spicy foods that can increase body heat.

Exercise in the morning or evening: Avoid exercising during the hottest part of the day, and instead work out in the morning or evening when it's cooler.

Use natural insect repellants: Avoid using chemical based insect repellents and opt for natural alternatives such as citronella, eucalyptus, or lavender essential oils.

Practice relaxation techniques: Summer can sometimes become a stressful time, make sure to include relaxation techniques such as yoga, meditation or deep breathing exercises.

Get enough sleep: Aim for 7-8 hours of sleep every night to keep your body rested and rejuvenated. Try to keep your bedroom cool and dark to promote quality sleep.


