

Have a blessed trip!



I invite you to pick up one of my favorite books, "Jesus of Nazareth— Archaeologists Retracing the Footsteps of Christ"

and follow Christ's footsteps through the Holy Land.

The author, Michael Hesemann, takes us on a journey from a thousand years of prophecies, the writings of the historian Flavius Josephus during Jesus' time, archeologists' findings that affirm so much written in the Old and New Testaments; the Magi, Zoroastrianism, Iran, the Christmas star, (fascinating). He pinpoints significant dates...Jesus' birth, His Bar Mitzvah, the wedding at Cana and Jesus' first public miracle.

Jesus' foster father, Joseph, probably a much younger man than usually portrayed, likely plied his trade as a master builder in Sepphoris, a cosmopolitan city being rebuilt by Antipas, as his capital, just an hour's walk from the Holy Family's house in Nazareth.

During this time, Jesus learned the trade of His father, and probably became fluent in Aramaic and Hebrew as well as Greek. Hessemann draws such a vivid picture of life during Jesus' time on earth. I learned how the water in the Pool of Bethesda was "troubled." We visited sites of many of Jesus' miracles. We found the likely site in Capernaum where Jesus would sometimes stay with Peter, his wife and motherin-law and his brother Andrew. Have a blessed trip!

Navigating Change: Importance of Amending Constitution & Bylaws

The constitution and bylaws of any organization serve as a guiding document that outlines the rules, procedures, and governance structure. Over time, it may become necessary to amend the constitution and bylaws to accommodate changing needs, or to improve the overall efficiency of the organization. The Bylaws Committee's goals are twofold: 1.) to review and recommend changes to the Guild's Executive Committee and the membership and 2.) effectively communicate these proposed changes to ensure transparency and member engagement. Since changes to the bylaws directly affect the rights and responsibilities of its members your opinions and concerns are valued. Therefore, the Bylaws Committee will utilize the newsletter to inform our members on the process of amending our constitution and bylaws. The membership will vote to amend or not amend at the April 2024 general meeting. A copy of the current constitution and bylaws are published in the 2023-24 Guild Directory.
