WHAT WOULD JESUS DO?

Jesus gave His blood so that you and I could live! Our Lord gave every last drop of His Precious Blood to save us! Can YOU spend one hour on Sunday, Nov. 12 th, giving just one unit of blood to save one of God's beloved children? Although an estimated 38% of the U.S. population is eligible to donate blood, less than 10% actually do each year. Blood cannot be manufactured—it can only come from generous donors. Every 2 seconds someone in the U.S. needs blood. A single car accident victim can require as many as 100 pints of blood. One donation can save the lives of 3 people. Please set aside one hour on Sunday, Nov. 12 th to

become just a little more Christ-like! Be somebody's hero!

Twice a year, since 2010, we have announced the 40 Days for Life campaign, which is a call to pray, fast and stand as witnesses for the value of every unborn human life. Since Downey has a very active abortion clinic on one of our busiest streets, this call is relevant and urgent for our Guild members. While going through the Catechism in a Year with Fr. Mike Schmitz, the teaching of the Catholic Church was duly noted regarding "The Proliferation of Sin". The third item, "by not disclosing or not hindering them when we have an obligation to do so" is what is happening when Christians in a city are indifferent and inactive in the face of child-killing. By actively coming out to pray and "stand witness" we are disclosing the evil going on at that location, and are hindering the loss of lives by our powerful prayers and fasting.

This is why 40 Days for Life helps us to be better Catholics living out our faith and standing up for truth in our culture. The fall campaign begins September 27 and ends on November 5, with the hope of prayer coverage every day from 8:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m. The director of 40 Days for Life in Downey is Omar Saucedo and his number is (323) 500-8930. Bring a prayer partner and your rosary and be of strong courage believing that our heavenly Father's will is for His children to stand up against the evil of child killing across our land, and especially in our own city of Downey.
