Why Choose An Independent Non-Profit?

- Control of Finances
- Registered 501 (c) (3) status
- Reimage the Catholic Women's Guild
- Explore opportunities to solicit donations
- No Archdiocese or Parish oversight



Risks & Losses

- Not an OLPH ministry
- Separation from OLPH Church



- The Guild cannot use "Our Lady of Perpetual Help Church" as part of its fixed name
- Possible restriction of using the OLPH icon
- Restricted use of church facilities
- Guild link to church website & email may be discontinued

Risks & Losses





- Loss of 73 years of Guild legacy
- May not be able to post notices in the church bulletin
- Unsustainable leadership
- Membership & Volunteer Retention
- Volunteer Burnout
- Uncertainty of sustaining Scholarship, Community Grant and Christmas Adopt-A-Family Programs

- The #1 reason small, non-profit organizations fail within five years is lack of money.
- The National Center of Charitable Statistics cites a failure rate over 30% within the first ten years.
